| Challah | Special plaited bread for Shabbat, there are usually 2 loaves. |
| Kippah | A small cap, often worn by Jewish men and boys. |
| Jesus | Believed by Christians to be the Son of God. |
| Salvation | The Christian belief that Jesus' death and resurrection have rescued Christians (from the effects of sin). |
| Parable | Astory with a hidden meaning, often told by Jesus to teach people something important. |







