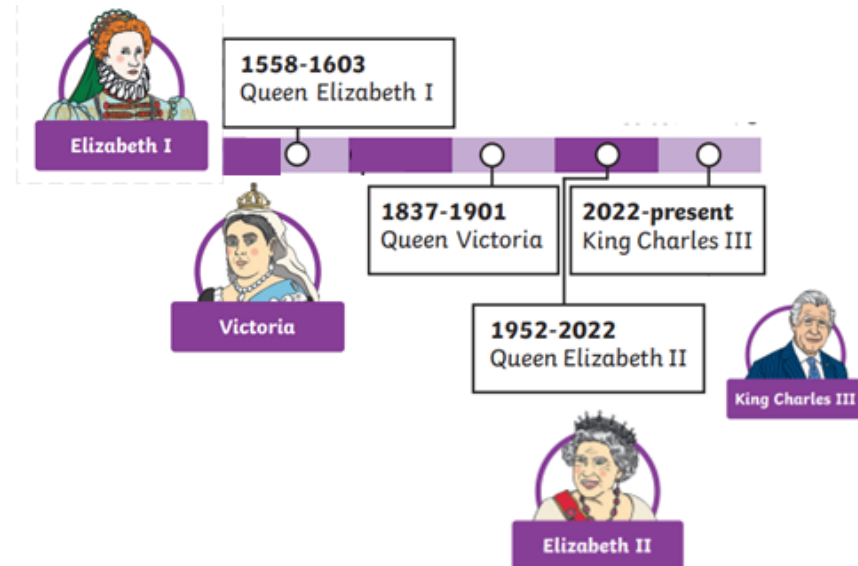


Key Vocabulary

Elizabethan	Relating to the reign of Elizabeth I, Queen of England.
Victorian	Relating to the reign of Queen Victoria.

- Queen Elizabeth I father was a very famous King called King Henry the VIII
- Queen Elizabeth I's reign was known as the Elizabethan Era, but fell within the Tudor period. She was the last Tudor monarch.
- Queen Victoria was Queen from 1819-1901.
- Queen Victoria famously wore black everyday after the death of her husband Prince Albert.
- Queen Elizabeth II was the longest reigning monarch Britain has ever had.
- Queen Elizabeth II's era is now known as the "New Elizabethan era"

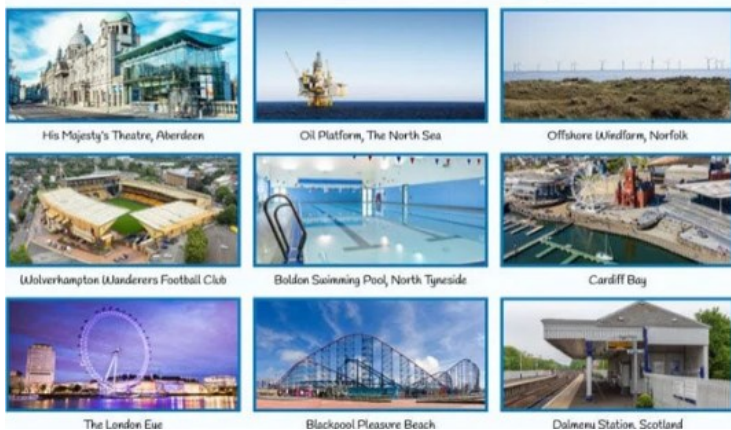

Key Knowledge

- Physical features include: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river and weather.
- Human features, include: city, town, port, harbour and shop.
- A key is a guide which explains what the symbols on a map means.
- The compass directions (North, East, South, West) and 'near, far, left and right' are locational and directional language which can be used to describe routes on map.

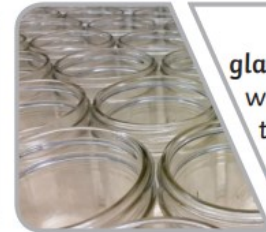
Materials	Materials are what objects are made from
Suitability	Suitability means having the properties which are right for a specific purpose
Properties	This is what a material is like and how it behaves (soft, stretchy, waterproof)
Absorbent	If something is absorbent it soaks liquid up
Transparent	Transparent objects can be seen through
Opaque	Opaque objects cannot be seen through
Manipulate	How a material can be manipulated into different shapes etc. This could be through twisting, pinching, stretching etc.

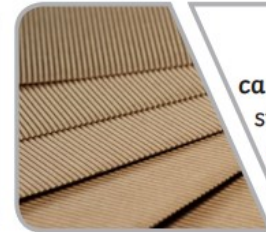

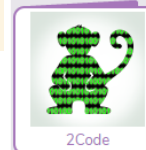


Action	Types of commands, which are run on an object. They could be used to move an object or change a property.

Sometimes a **script** doesn't work exactly how we want it to. This might be caused by an error in the **algorithm**.



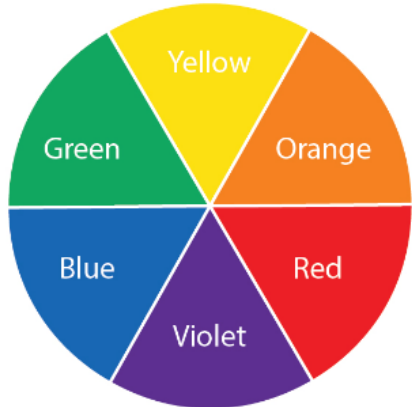

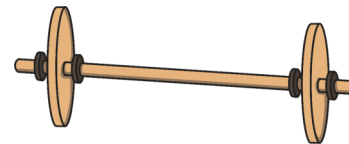

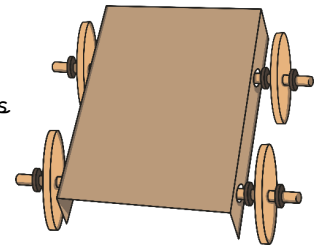


Template	A guide.
