

Nursery

In Big Stars we have been learning about families. We have been drawing our families on special house paper and focusing on drawing facial features.









Reception

In Bumblebee Class, we have recently learnt a new word 'join' and we have been using this language in the construction area when we have been building and joining items together. We have also been choosing the right resources to carry out a plan which has been a lot of fun. We start by drawing what we are going to build or make before creating it. We then talk to our peers about whether it looks like the design we drew on our plan. We have really enjoyed drawing what we are going to build and seeing whether it will looks the same!









Year one

This week in Badger Class we have been recalling our previously learnt knowledge on primary and secondary colours. As part of our task time, we explored mixing all of the primary colours and testing them to see which colours we could make. We learnt that by mixing the primary colours red and yellow we can make orange, blue and red makes purple and yellow and blue makes green!







Year Two

We have had a fantastic start to our year in Owl Class. The children have been writing incredible stories about their trip to the woods as a shrunken child! That's right, Miss Amos! sprayed their class with a magic shrinking spray, and they all became miniature! We took the children to the forest school area where they found lots of woodland creatures to ride on, have dinner with and run away from. The children then became authors of their own imaginative tale and wrote wonderful stories about their journey "into the woods". We have also had some extremely fun task time activities. When reading the Hansel and Gretel story we found the wicked witch lived in a house of bread, cake and sweets – very unhealthy! To fit with our learning of a balanced and healthy diet, the children created houses from fruit and vegetables. This was so much fun!









Visit from Father Mark



This week we welcomed Father Mark from St Mary's in Ewell to Wallace Fields Infant School to launch Harvest Festival. Father Mark explained to the children what Christians believe about Harvest and why they celebrate Harvest Festival. He demonstrated what Christian's believe by planting some daffodil bulbs, giving them soil, water and sunlight and a sprinkle of magic to help them grow. Father Mark explained that Christians believe the sprinkle of magic is from God and therefore harvesting crops is something that should be celebrated. Father Mark explained that Christians celebrate Harvest Festival by gathering food and giving it to people who are struggling to afford food for themselves or their families. Mrs Male explained that although we are not all Christians, we can all take part in the Harvest Festival by donating food to our local foodbank because this demonstrates our value of 'Kindness'. 




