

Staff Spotlight

I have been at Wallace Fields Infant and Nursery school for over 20 years, after joining as a Year One class teacher in 2002. During this time, I have taught across all the year groups from Nursery up to Year 2 and have led most subject areas, my favourite being Personal, Social, Health and Emotional Development. After two maternity leaves, I returned to the school on a part time basis, continuing in a class teacher based role as a job share and then in later years as a non class based member of the Senior Leadership Team. During this time I also enjoyed mentoring many trainee teachers which led to me taking on the role of a student school supervisor at Roehampton University, which I continue to do alongside my Wallace Fields role.



Currently I work part time at Wallace Fields as part of the Senior Leadership team with my main focus being the development of our Nursery provision and as a support tutor for the Surrey South Farnham SCITT programme. One of the things I enjoy about my role is how varied it is! My day can involve leading our morning Nursery training meeting, supporting and settling children, meeting with the Leadership team to set our priorities for the week, working in the nursery, induction of new staff, working with the office team on Nursery communication, planning and monitoring with the Nursery teachers and much more! People often ask me why I have stayed at Wallace Fields and do I not need a new challenge, but I have never felt like I have needed to leave Wallace Fields to have this. Put simply, Wallace Fields never stands still! Every year there are new initiatives to implement, new research to consider and every member of staff that joins the team brings something new to the school to learn from. But, the main reason I love Wallace Fields is the people. It is a special place to be, made by the whole school community including staff, children and their families.

Firework and bonfire safety



Advice from Surrey Fire and Rescue Service

Firework and bonfire evenings provide great entertainment, providing everyone follows the right safety procedures and remembers that fireworks can be dangerous if not used correctly.

Surrey Fire and Rescue Service recommend that the safest way to enjoy these activities is to attend a professionally organised event. If you are having your own celebration please use common sense and follow our advice to avoid injuries or damage to your property.

Fireworks are a great way to celebrate, but please remember important advice:

- Only buy fireworks from a reputable supplier, and ensure they carry a CE or UKCA mark.
- Store fireworks in a sealed metal container
- Keep children and pets a safe distance away from fireworks and away from lighters

- Be aware of wind direction and ensure you have sufficient space to set them off
- Never go back to them once they are lit. Even if a firework hasn't gone off, it could still explode
- Respect your neighbours, let them know so they can keep pets indoors.

Bonfires

Bonfires are a popular event to host this time of year, and can be a great way to spend time with family and friends as long as they are held safely. Please keep everyone safe this Autumn and:

- Don't use flammable liquids to start a bonfire
- Only burn untreated wood, not painted items, or dangerous materials such as furniture or aerosol cans
- Keep bonfires a manageable size and clear a 10meter zone around the area from foliage.
- Never leave bonfires unattended, keep a bucket of water or hosepipe nearby in case of emergency.

Enjoy bonfire night and firework celebrations this Autumn, and remember, in an emergency always call 999. Find more information on safety around fireworks and bonfires on the **seasonal fire safety web page.**
