As we approach the end of term, we hope you will join us during some of our festivities. There are lots of treats in store, including beautiful singing and acting in our Christmas performances. Please reiterate these strategies with your children when out and about, and remind them to stay with you when riding on scooters and bikes so as not to bump into any pedestrians. This week in my assembly we explored questions around cultures, languages and race. We discussed how family traditions are important to talk about and the importance of everyone being treated fairly. We also learned our British Values song.

Over the last two weeks, as well as being busy preparing for the festivities, I have seen some excellent learning; puppet making in Year 2, RE exploring Christianity and the nativity story in Year 1, creating wonderful habitats for minibeasts in Reception and fantastic wintery crafts in Nursery.



Nursery


This week Big Stars have been practicing their scissor skills by cutting out winter shapes or drawing their own shapes to cut out.





Reception

We have been learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes and identifying these shapes in the environment. The children are able to use their mathematical knowledge and language to explore making famous buildings in the construction area. In the art area the children have also enjoyed printing with 2D and 3D shapes to discover different surfaces made by the shapes.

Year One

This week in Science, Bader Class have been conducting some exciting experiments. We have been learning about fair testing and why it is important to keep certain variables the same. We tested wrapping different materials around eggs including tin foil, bubble wrap and old socks. We dropped the eggs from exactly the same height to keep it a fair test. Before we started, we made our predictions. Lots of our eggs were protected and a few smashed along the way!







Year Two

The past few weeks Owl Class have been learning about different artists. We looked at the work of Kandinsky who listens to music to hear the colours he paints. In our classroom we created a playlist of popular music, classical, rock and roll, pop, and listened to how the music made us feel. We used patterns and shapes with bright, bold colours to create large scale artwork! Next we looked at the work of Henry Fraser. He is an artist who became paralysed from the neck down after being in an unfortunate accident in his childhood. He uses our school values of determination and fantastic effort to create incredible paintings using his mouth. As you can see from our photos, the children loved the challenge set for them - to paint the outline of a flower using the paintbrush in their mouths!

Penalty Notices for Unauthorised Leave

With Christmas holidays approaching, we thought it was important to remind you of our Attendance Policy. We do not authorise term-time holiday in line with an agreement with the local cluster of primary schools.


The Education Welfare Service, acting on behalf of Surrey County Council may issue a Penalty Notice as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school, and requires the recipient to pay a fixed amount.

If a child is taken out of school for more than 5 days/10 sessions unauthorised leave (this need not be consecutive), without the authorisation of the school, the amount payable on issue of a Penalty Notice is £60 per adult in the household per child. This rises to £120 per adult in the household per child if paid after the 21-day period, but within 28 days. If not paid, legal action will be taken against the recipient for the period shown on the Penalty Notice. The local authority, Surrey County Council, must prosecute the parent/carer for failing to ensure regular school attendance under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Headteachers at both Wallace Fields Infant School and Junior School are in regular contact about family absence requests.

Year Two trip to The Natural History Museum

Last week, Year Two travelled into London to the Natural History Museum to take part in the Oceans project. Whilst there, the children had the chance to explore a few of the exhibits like the dinosaurs, creepy crawlies, and mammals from around the world. The children took this chance to discover new and interesting facts as well as observing historical sources and artifacts like fossilised bones. Later in the day the children made their way to the Attenborough studio where they took part in a deep diving adventure into the world's oceans. They imagined they were on a submarine travelling to different parts of the ocean to observe the animal life that make the ocean their habitat. They then thought carefully about the impact humans are having on the oceans and the problems things like plastic can cause for our ocean life. As the year progresses, we will be thinking about the ways we can help protect our oceans and make our planet a better place for all living things who inhabit it.


The Governing Body is made up of individuals with a broad range of skills who collectively help to set and implement the aims, ethos and strategic direction of the school by volunteering their time.
