Our assessments show our strongest readers are the readers supported at home alongside the provision provided at school. Just a reminder please could all children bring their Reading Records each day at the start of the new term. We regularly have volunteers and additional adults who read with the children who write in the children's Reading Records. Teachers also stick the focus of the week for reading in the diary so you can revisit vocabulary and comprehension with the children at home. Please also remember you have access to previously set texts via the eBook platform so you are able to build the children's reading mileage. This week we are sending lots of love and well wishes to Mrs Wadey who has not been at school due to a planned operation.

We wish all of our families and children a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. We look forward to welcoming the children back to our new Year to our new topic 'Zoom to the Moon'.



I have also had the pleasure of leading Art across the school, and being involved in the Epsom and Ewell Art festival which the children's art work is selected for in the Autumn term.
