








Year One

This week in Badger class we have been writing amazing setting descriptions for the story 'Beegu'. We have been learning lots of new writing skills including writing noun phrases and using exciting adjectives. We also learnt to include our senses, including what the character might smell and see, to make our writing exciting for the reader.



Year Two

In this term's yoga lessons so far, Owl class has been focusing on creating positions. We thought of various animals and objects that might be found in different places, and followed specific instruction to move our bodies into the correct positions before reasting and taking deep breathes between each one. Some of the positions were called 'the boat' and 'the bear'. We created a flow of positions and held each one for ten seconds before allowing our bodies to recover. We discussed how yoga makes our bodies stronger because our muscles must tense in each position.

Astronaut Training Day

On Friday the children in Year Two took part in an astronaut training afternoon. Staff in the Year 2 classrooms opened up their rooms to a range of activities that allowed children to explore different aspects of life as an astronaut.

We know astronauts are very intelligent people so a quick space knowledge quiz kicked off the afternoon. This was followed by mimicking zero-gravity with the use of a ping pong ball and a hairdryer.

Next children looked at images of Earth taken by the British astronaut, Tim Peake, whilst he stayed on the ISS. The children used these images to locate famous landmarks in London and their local area.

We put on space gloves and had a go at building some fiddly things from small Lego pieces and the children commented on how hard it was when the gloves were so thick. This showed the children that the spacesuits astronauts wear are for their own safety but not always the most useful thing, when jobs in space are tricky!

Finally, the children designed their own spacesuits. They used their knowledge of materials from last terms science lessons to think about what material would be best suited for an astronaut.

Penalty Notices for Unauthorised Attendance

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authorisation for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a Penalty Notice. Currently the amount payable under a Penalty Notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that Penalty Notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents/carers and two children will receive four Penalty Notices.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Governor of the Month visit from Carolyn Devereaux Tuesday 12th December 2023



Firstly, I would like to wish you all a happy and healthy new year on behalf of myself and all the Governors at Wallace Fields Infant and Nursery School. On 12th December, I was in school for my Governor of the Month visit, so I thought I would update you on my day.

The morning started with an opportunity to see the wonderful KS1 Christmas Production. This was always one of my highlights of the school calendar as a parent when my own children were here. All the children did so well and impressed me with their singing, dancing and acting.

After the Christmas show, the remainder of the day involved meeting with various staff and a selection of pupils from Reception to Y2. It was an informative day and gave me a real insight into the busy life of the school. It was a lovely time to visit in the run up to Christmas. I was impressed at how calm the children were despite only having a few days left until the end of term.

I met with Mrs Male to discuss the school's equality and diversity plan and hear what actions were in place after a recent review. Mrs Male talked through accessibility for wheelchair users and what adaptations would be needed in the future. It was good to hear that all lessons and assemblies promote equality and diversity. Recently many more books in various languages have been purchased to reflect the current school community. It was interesting to learn that the school website can now be translated into different languages.

I then interviewed a selection of pupils from Reception to Y2 to find out what they knew about internet safety. It was reassuring that all the children I met with mentioned that E-Safety was taught in school. They all told me that they enjoyed using the iPads and Chromebooks but knew what to do if they saw something that upset them. The children I spoke to said they would talk to a grown up at school or at home if they saw something worrying online. The apps they mentioned they used were appropriate for their age groups. It is definitely worth chatting to your children about how to keep safe online at home too, and always check that settings on devices that children are using are secure.

During my visit, I also met with Mr Vinall who explained how he does daily inspection walks to ensure the school environment is safe for everyone. The new gates around the school are a great addition and the school was all in good order. We discussed the plans for more lighting in the playground in the future. I then completed some statutory safeguarding checks that are undertaken on every visit.

My visit concluded with a meeting with Mrs Amos and Miss Mumford to hear about plans for reading and writing across the school. New books have been ordered to inspire the children's writing and help them with the new theme. There was a discussion about possibly inviting authors in to talk to the pupils or children writing to authors. Mrs Amos mentioned there will continue to be a focus on reading this term. Children are receiving regular handwriting and spelling lessons and different ways to teach spelling are being explored. Both teachers felt they had already seen an improvement in how children were editing and improving their writing in class. The day ended with sharing my observations with Mrs Muir. I would like to thank all the staff and pupils who made me feel very welcome on my visit.

Is My Child Too III for School?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school or nursery when they're unwell.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.

If you do keep your child at home, it is important to phone the school each day to let us know that your child won't be in and to give us details of the illness so that we can take any necessary action (i.e. informing vulnerable members of staff or advising on exclusion periods).



Moments Matter, Attendance Counts

We are seeing a significant number of families taking term-time leaves of absence, with some absences of two or more weeks. Children have an average of seven individual lessons each day.

A week off school equates to 35 missed lessons which your child will not be able to repeat.
