
I am delighted to announce Alice Feldwick and James Bradshaw are our new Co-Chairs of the Governing Board with Emma Bailey being our new Vice Chair.

Nursery

Little Stars have been working on their fine motor skills. They worked really hard to thread cheerios onto pipe cleaners using their pinchy fingers. They then took a trip to the field to hang their pipe cleaners on the trees for the birds to eat the cheerios.









Reception

Over the last two weeks the children have had great fun building rockets and making helmets using the large construction resources to help them consider how we can fly to the moon! They have also enjoyed learning about the different planets which make up the solar system. The children have learnt lots of facts about the planets and can tell you which planet is their favourite and why. We have also shared with the class lots of stories about rockets, aliens and astronauts, and the children have been able to compose and write their own sentences using their phonic knowledge. This week we have also been representing numbers in different ways using foam and dice. Butterfly Class enjoyed making messy number patterns.











Year One

This week in Art we have been using wax crayons to create our own landscape pictures, applying mark making techniques that we have learnt such as hatching. We used Vicent van Gogh's work as inspiration. In DT we cut out stars and experimented with different materials to try and make our stars strong and stable. We are going to hang them from the classroom ceiling once they are ready.







Year Two

In Year Two this week we have been writing instructions! We have read the story, Man on the Moon by Simon Bartram, and were inspired to write a set of instructions to inform space tourists on how to enjoy their holidays to the moon and other planets in our solar system. The children acted out various imperative verbs which allowed them to be very bossy to one another! They then learnt to use time adverbials so they could sequence the instructions correctly! Penalty Notices for Unauthorised Attendance

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authorisation for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a Penalty Notice. Currently the amount payable under a Penalty Notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that Penalty Notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents/carers and two children will receive four Penalty Notices.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Governor of the Month visit from Alice Feldwick



Dear Parents,

Hope you are all well and have settled back into the school routine, albeit a bit frosty. I had the pleasure of coming into school on my recent Governor of the Month visit and I wanted to share some insights of my day.

I started the day by attending the Year 2 curriculum workshop, presented by Mrs Amos. I found the session was very well run, engaging, informative and well presented, so a huge thank you to Mrs Amos for putting it together. Being a parent myself, I managed to pick up quite a few tips to help at home with my children. I then met with Miss Kelly to discuss the Well Being plan for Pupils, Families and Staff, and had a look through some of the Learning Journals, with particular focus on PHSE learning which was very evident in their journals. Miss Kelly is a great lead in this field, with plenty of experience so I am looking forward to seeing how the action plan will be implemented in the school.

It was then lunchtime, so I joined the children in the hall, I timed my visit perfectly as I was there for the New Years Celebration lunch which was lovely. The children were all very kind and excited to have a "Governor" present, I even got asked if I worked with Rishi Sunak, probably a bit disappointed when I told them I am not quite in the "Government". It is always great to see the children in this natural environment, they were all very welcoming and talkative, I had some lovely conversations.

Next stop was a highlight, where I had some interaction with some very interesting young people. We have recently introduced a new Behaviour Policy (it is on the website for anyone that would like to read) and the teachers have been working hard to introduce it to the children. I spoke to a number of Year 1 and 2 children and I was very impressed to see that they were all very aware of our school's Golden Rules (Ready, Respectful, Responsible) and our Values (Kindness, Friendship, Respect, Reflection, Effort, Determination, Good Manners). They also shared examples of how they demonstrate the values on a daily basis. As the policy is new, it was impressive to see how they have managed to grasp it so quickly and I also welcome the changes to the policy.

I completed my day by reviewing the Sports Premium Action Plan and I am excited to see all the new ideas that Mr Cliffe will be introducing over the year.

Thank you again to all the staff and pupils for making me feel very welcome, I had a great time and look forward to my next visit!

We endeavour to achieve a high standard in all our activities at school and we expect this to be reflected in the appearance of all our pupils. Here is a reminder of our uniform requirements:

Winter Uniform (worn from after October Half Term until the end of Spring term)

- Grey pinafore dress, skirt, shorts or trousers
- White polo shirt (school logo preferred, otherwise plain)
- Red sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan with school logo
- Red/grey tights or black/grey socks
- Black sensible school shoes (not trainers) with velcro fastening (no sandals, slip-ons, boots or open toes). Shoes should be suitable for school wear enabling your child to play safely at playtimes.

Summer Uniform (worn from the start of Summer term until October Half Term)

- Red and white gingham dress, or
- Grey pinafore dress, skirt, shorts or trousers
- White polo shirt (school logo preferred, otherwise plain)
- Red sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan with school logo
- White/grey socks or red/grey tights
- Black sensible school shoes (not trainers) with velcro fastening (no sandals, slip-ons, boots or open toes). Shoes should be suitable for school wear enabling your child to play safely at playtimes.

PE Kit (worn all day on PE days)

- White t-shirt (school logo preferred, otherwise plain)
- Red shorts (shadow striped/plain)
- Black jogging bottoms or leggings (plain)
- Red sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan with school logo
- Trainers/black plimsolls with velcro fastening

Personal Appearance

- Hair should be clean, tidy and off the face
- Hair past shoulder length should be tied back
- Pupils are expected to wear red or white hair accessories only
- No nail polish, earrings, jewellery, or smart watches may be worn to school

Nursery Uniform

We ask all Nursery children to wear uniform as we feel it promotes inclusion and confidence and saves all their lovely clothes getting so dirty!

- Purple polo shirt with Nursery logo
- Purple jumper with Nursery logo
- Purple cardigan with Nursery logo
- Purple fleece with Nursery logo
- Purple summer dress

We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Parent App


We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday



Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:


- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.
