


This week has marked children's mental health week where we kickstarted the week with a mindfulness workshop where children learnt practise strategies for staying mindful and having a positive mindset. Miss Amos delivered our mental health assembly where the children discussed 'My Voice Matters' which is about empowering children and young people by providing them with the tools they need to express themselves. This week was also Safer Internet Day. Children explored how to keep safe online through story telling. Children corrected the behaviour of characters to let them know how to stay safe online.

This week our wonderful Epsom College students came to drop off 'random acts of kindness' for the children of Wallace Fields Infant School and Nursery. The students had knitted handmade worry worms for children to find around the school. We work closely with Epsom College as a service provider and welcome Epsom College students into the school each week who volunteer to listen to children read, help children in the classrooms and support with gardening around the school. Their support is much appreciated.

Nursery

This week Big Stars have been learning about Lunar New Year. During group time they have been exploring using ink to copy some number symbols. In discovery time they have been making lanterns, mark making in glitter, using chop sticks in the role play area and practicing their cutting skills to make a dragon.



Reception

This week the children have embarked on a literary adventure through the pages of the story 'Whatever Next!' written the amazing author Jill Murphy. This story has enabled the children to contemplate travelling to the moon and explore the different sights and sounds they may encounter. Butterfly Class have enthusiastically embraced the story and have been able to retell the main sequence of the events using story props. The children have participated in various activities to enhance their learning experience, promoting language development, creativity, and social skills. They have designed and decorated their own spaceships, using counting and making repeated patterns with moon rocks! To celebrate their journey to the moon, our special 'Whatever Next Day!' allowed the children to develop their imagination and love of reading.





Year One

This week in Badger Class we worked really hard during our 'Mental Health Awareness Week' activities. We created a 'What Matters to Me' poster and explored lots of different ways that we can improve our wellbeing. We looked at what is important to us and why these things matter. We created some wonderful posters!







Year Two

Over the past two weeks, Year Two have been imagining they are astronauts blasting off on a space adventure to the International Space Station. The children have been immersed in real footage of astronauts setting off on their adventure, what life is like on the ISS and finally descending on the worst rollercoaster ride back to Earth. The children each wrote their three-part stories and were then split into groups of three. Within these groups, each child then published a chapter: one about launching, one about life on the ISS and one on the descent. The children put their chapters together to form their own published "Journey to Space" stories for our book corners!



Staff Spotlight Kirstie Smith

I started working at WFIS almost 11 years ago! I started in KidsQuest as a playworker and became a one-to-one for a child in nursery soon after. I knew immediately that I had found my passion, enabling children to grow. I did School Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) and trained to teach at WFIS in Year 2. Once becoming a qualified teacher, I taught in Reception for three years.



I came out of Reception to cover all year groups and was given the opportunity to train to be a SENCO, as SEND has aways been my passion.

The element of my role I enjoy the most is supporting children and their families on their individual journeys and being able to witness the pupils' growth, development over the course of their learning journey with us. I have also had the pleasure to work with lots of lovely pupils and their families over the last 11 years, some of whom I still hear from today.

My most memorable moment was teaching in Reception where we were studying the story 'Supertato' and we created an immersive environment of storytelling. We searched all around the school to rescue the class puppet from the Evil Pea. It was joyful to witness the children's excitement and still today children who are now in secondary school still mention that day when we meet.

Young Artists' Summer Show

We are excited to invite all children from Reception to Year 2 to submit artwork for the Young Artists' Summer Show 2024. All children who submit a piece of artwork will receive a special certificate but only six pieces of art can be chosen to submit to the Summer Show. There is no theme to the exhibition this year, and the artwork can use any medium, e.g. painting, collage, 3D sculpture, photograph or a combination. Please can each submission include a short statement to accompany the work. This statement should add context to the work and often helps the judges understand the work better. Wherever possible, the statement should be written by the artist themselves (Year 1 and 2) and should attempt to include information about why they created the work and what it means to them. Please could all artwork be brought into school by 11th March 2014. Here are some examples of artwork from last year's exhibition to give you some inspiration interesting descriptions to get you started.

Penalty Notices for Unauthorised Attendance

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authorisation for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a Penalty Notice. Currently the amount payable under a Penalty Notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that Penalty Notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents/carers and two children will receive four Penalty Notices.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
